





WASHINGTON - The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Civil Works Program (Corps) released today a list of the programs included as part of President Biden's Justice40 Initiative, which aims to deliver 40% of the overall benefits of climate, clean energy, affordable and sustainable housing, clean water, and other investments to disadvantaged communities that are marginalized, underserved, and overburdened by pollution. There are 11 covered programs within the Corps, each of which will help to advance the Biden-Harris administration's commitment to environmental justice. In total, hundreds of




